### **Letter from the Executive Director**

Last week I spent a few days at the Heartland Economic Development Course in Blue Springs, MO. Peers from Midwest communities, both larger and smaller than DeWitt, were impressed with the things I shared about our community. In many regards, we are ahead of the curve. We have many of the jobs and amenities they are working hard to attract, build or improve. Here's what else I had confirmed:



A community's <u>best prospects for growth come from the businesses they already have</u>. This isn't a surprise; we all know it's easier to grow the customers we have than it is to recruit new ones! Supporting our existing businesses and helping them grow is a top priority for the DCDC for this very reason. I want to know your business and be a resource for you. So if we have not yet met, give me a call, I'd welcome the opportunity to visit with you.

The top two reasons a business considers moving to (or leaving) a community is 1<sup>st</sup>, available space for them to do business in and 2<sup>nd</sup>, workforce. We can do a number of things to create space for businesses, but ultimately it comes down to the <u>people</u> they can employ. The Laborshed Analysis completed last month provides details about who works in DeWitt today or who may consider a position in the coming months. The future workforce is just as important; hence our efforts to connect local businesses and schools in meaningful ways, better preparing our students to be outstanding employees and residents.

After a business decides they like a region, they consider the <u>quality of life</u> their employees will have access to. Quality of life also includes the vibrancy of our retail businesses. I point this out because the first week of May is <u>National Small Business Week</u>. 
