To make it easier than ever, the DeWitt Chamber & Development Company (DCDC) is excited to introduce the **Chamber Bucks eGift Card**. Please note, the current PAPER CHECK version of Chamber Bucks will remain in place with no changes! The Chamber Bucks eGift Card will allow consumers the opportunity to purchase Chamber Bucks online and/or with a credit card! We are still signing merchants up, but the link to purchase the eGift Card is live at www.dewittiowa.org!

Both the paper and eGift Card version of Chamber Bucks can be purchased as gifts, for self-use, and by companies to use for employee rewards, customer appreciation, anniversary gifts, and anything they might have used a gift card for. Most importantly, the dollars stay local and benefit the shops, restaurants, and businesses in your community. (Shameless promotion: If your company purchases any employee gifts for the holidays, or you have any hard to buy for people on your shopping list, consider Chamber Bucks!)

Anyone can purchase Chamber Buck Checks at the DCDC office, DeWitt Bank & Trust, First Central State Bank, at and Emma Rae's. The eGift Cards only work at participating DCDC member businesses who choose to opt-in. There is no cost to opt-in.



STEM Fest & Manufacturing Day 2019!

October is Manufacturing Month and the DeWitt Chamber & Development Company (DCDC) celebrated at Central DeWitt High School by inviting students from Central DeWitt High School & Middle School, St. Joseph Catholic School, Northeast High School, Clinton High School and Calamus-Wheatland High School to participate in the 4th bi-annual event on October 8th!



This is an event provides career exposure to area students expose as well as helps them to begin thinking about life after high school. All students were given the opportunity to visit with local manufacturing, CTE and STEM related businesses during a Business Expo. See a list of all who participated here. Students had their questions answered and learned about career paths they may not have been aware of. Students also heard from local manufacturing professionals, Adam Gravert from Guardian Industries. IowaWorks Update



lowaWORKS Centers across the state will hold events for employers and job seekers as part of Registered Apprenticeship Appreciation and Awareness Week Nov. 11-17.

lowa Workforce Development is partnering with the U.S. Department of Labor/Office of Apprenticeship and the lowa

Economic Development Authority to grow Registered Apprenticeship Programs in Iowa. The work is supported by \$2.8 million in Apprenticeship USA State Expansion Grants from the

U.S. Department of Labor. As part of the grant funding, organizations who create a new Registered Apprenticeship Program or add an additional occupation in the industries of healthcare, information technology or advanced manufacturing can receive an incentive of \$350 per Registered Apprentice or \$500 per Registered Apprentice who qualify as an underrepresented population (women, minorities, veteran, youth, or people with disabilities).

lowa WORKS and Eastern lowa Community College will host its 3rd Annual Apprenticeship Fair on Thursday, November 14 from 1-3 pm at Scott Community College's Culinary and Hospitality Facility – 500 Belmont Road, Bettendorf.

Employers and local unions will provide information on high demand career areas. Those who attend the FREE event can see first-hand how they can learn while they earn through a registered apprenticeship.

Employers and job seekers interested in learning more about Registered Apprenticeship opportunities are also encouraged to visit www.earnandlearniowa.gov. The website provides a high level overview on how a Registered Apprenticeship functions and provides forms for job seekers and employers to complete to receive information.
